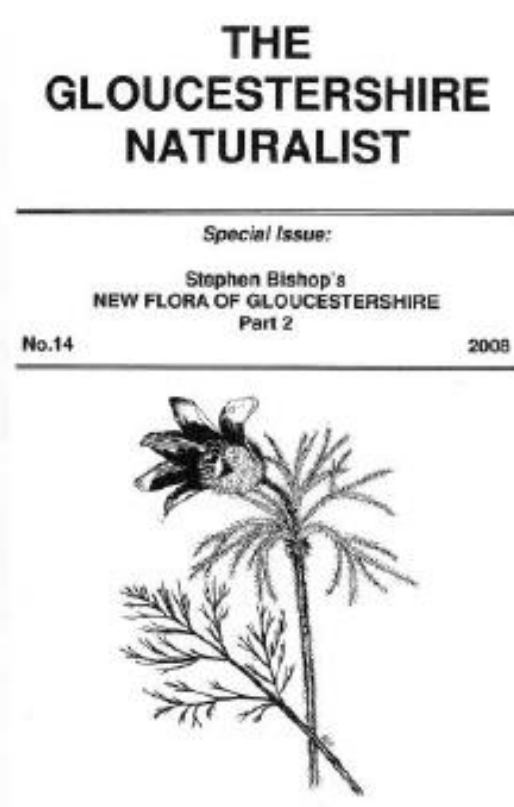
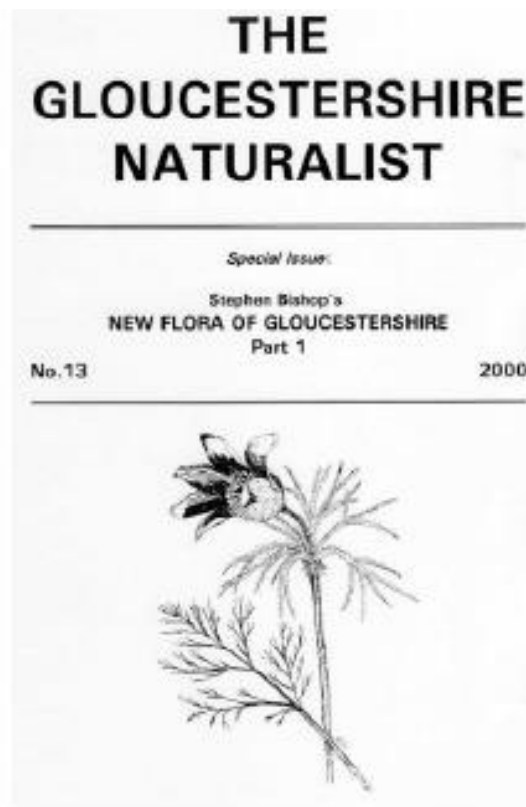


# The Gloucestershire Naturalist Volumes 13 (2000) & 14 (2008)



These two volumes of The Gloucestershire Naturalist were completed by the editors and originally published as “special editions” in 2000 and 2008, both after the untimely death of the author and driving force behind the work that went into producing them, the late Stephen Bishop.

The original format is A5 (210 x 148mm) bound volumes with card covers but the scanned images have been enlarged in order to adequately capture the detail and clarity they require, especially so for part 2, Volume 14 where the taxa dot maps are rather smaller with 4 per page than those in part 1, Volume 13. The reason for this difference is that in part 1 there is included the text to accompany the maps whereas in part 2, the maps are printed without text since Stephen Bishop was unable to complete that part of the work before his death.

However, it was felt that the information held in the maps alone was sufficiently valuable and detailed to make it worth publishing in this format and make it available, rather than not to publish, and thereby lose it.

Both volumes are complete and scanned as published complete with the tables of contents and indexes to enable specific species to be found. The images are pdf files, readable on screen, printable or can be copied from the disc to a computer drive for ease of access. Each volume is broken down into sections to make the pdf files manageable sizes (Maximum 10 megabyte).

The complete work is available on a single CD ROM disc.
